Whereas Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs), rooted in the Mission of the College, define and identify the knowledge, behaviors, and skills the College would like students to acquire and develop throughout their CCSF educational experiences;

Whereas the Institutional Assessment Plan specifies that Institutional Learning Outcomes (ILOs) shall be assessed on a regular basis through a process with broad faculty participation coordinated by the Student Learning Outcome (SLO) Coordinators and the Academic Senate's Student Learning Outcome Committee (SLOC);

Whereas a thorough assessment of ILO 2, Communication, was conducted in 2022-2023 and included multiple measures and dialogue about the ILO, including quantitative analysis of assessments of SLOs mapped up from courses through programs to ILOs; five case studies to capture student experiences with ILO 2, and in-depth discussion at the SLOC meetings on several occasions:

Whereas the results of this assessment were compiled into the Spring 2023 ILO 2A ssessment Report by the SLO Coordinators and approved by the SLOC on September 1, 2023, and are available to share with the college community and the community at large;
